The show follows Jon, a composer struggling to break into New York City's theater scene, and is filled with unforgettable songs including "30/90," "Johnny Can't Decide," and the Sondheim-inspired "Sunday." This new production of tick, tick ...BOOM! will feature new orchestrations and vocal arrangements and will be expanded to feature a small ensemble cast in addition to the three announced principals. The production, produced by Broadway Center Stage Artistic Director and Kennedy Center Vice President and Executive Producer of Theater, Jeffrey Finn, will feature a band with musicians from the Kennedy Center Opera House Orchestra, and include choreography by Paul McGill, musical supervision by Stephen Oremus, and music direction by Ben Cohn, Scenic and Projection design by Paul Tate dePoo III, Video and Projection design by Nathan Scheuer, costume design by Andrea Hood, lighting design by Cory Pattak, and sound design by Haley Parcher. Neil Patrick Harris is a multi-hyphenate known for iconic roles on both stage and screen. A veteran of the theatre, Harris originated the role of Hedwig in the Tony Award[®]-winning Broadway production of *Hedwig and the Angry Inch* (Tony[®], Drama League and Drama Desk Awards). His additional theatrical credits include *Peter Pan Goes Wrong* (Barrymore Theatre), *Into the Woods* (NY City Center), *Assassins* (Studio 54), Proof (Walter Kerr Theatre), *Cabaret* (Studio 54), *Company* (New York Philharmonic), *All My Sons* (Geffen Theater), *The Paris Letter* (Kirk Douglas Theater), *Sweeney Todd* (NY Phil, San Francisco Symphony Orchestra), *Romeo and Juliet* (Old Globe Theater), *Rent* (Los Angeles/2nd National Tour), *Luck, Pluck, Virtue* (Atlantic Theater Co.), and *tick, tick...BOOM!* (Menier Chocolate Factory).

Utilizing his theatrical expertise behind the curtain, Harris made his musical directorial debut with the Hollywood Bowl's staging of Jonathan Larson's *Rent*. His additional directing credits include *Nothing to Hide* (Pershing Square Signature Center & Geffen Theater), *The Expert at the Card Table* (Ediburgh Fringe Festival & Broad Stage Theater), and *I Am Grock* (El Portal Theater). Additionally, Harris produced *In & Of Itself*, an Off-Broadway magic show directed by Frank Oz at the Daryl Roth Theater in New York.

Harris is a five-time Emmy Award®-winner and New York Times bestselling author.

Brandon Uranowitz received 2023 Tony, Drama Desk, and Outer Critics Circle Awards for his performance as Ludwig/Nathan in Tom Stoppard's *Leopoldstadt*. He was previously nominated for Tony[®] and Drama Desk awards for the Broadway revivals of Lanford Wilson's *Burn This* (2019) and *Falsettos* (2017). He received a 2015 Tony nomination for his performance as Adam Hochberg in *An American in Paris*. Other Broadway credits include *The Band's Visit*, *Prince of Broadway*, and *Baby, It's You!* Uranowitz also starred in the acclaimed 2021 Off-Broadway revival of *Assassins* at CSC, directed by John Doyle; he garnered critical acclaim as Arnold Beckoff in Harvey Fierstein's *Torch Song Trilogy* (Helen Hayes Award nomination) at D.C.'s Studio Theater; and, played opposite Anthony Rapp and Adam Pascal the Broadway National Tour of Jonathan Larson's *RENT*, directed by Michael Greif. She previously starred as 'Ruby' in the second season of Lifetime's acclaimed television series *UnREAL*.

She recently returned to Broadway as 'Cinderella' starring in the hit revival of the Tony Award[®] Winning production of *Into The Woods*, a role she originated last year in the Encores!, City Center Production, for which she garnered rave reviews. She also starred as 'Eliza' in Broadway's Tony Award[®]-winning musical *Hamilton* and is well known for starring as 'Natasha' in the Broadway production of *Natasha, Pierre & The Great Comet of 1812*. For *The Great Comet*, Benton was nominated for the 2017 Tony

She had previously played the role of 'Natasha' at the American Repertory Theater and starred as 'Nabulungi' in the West End and U.S. national tour of *The Book of Mormon*. Benton is a graduate of Carnegie Mellon University.

Grey Henson can currently be seen starring in the Tony[®]-nominated production, *Shucked* on Broadway and can be seen recurring as Tate on Netflix's *Girls5Eva*. Recently he made his feature film debut in Denzel Washington's, *A Journal For Jordan*, and can be seen in the feature film, *The Good Half* which premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival starring Nick Jonas. Henson was last seen starring as Damian Hubbard in Broadway's *Mean Girls* the Musical for which he was nominated for a Tony Award[®] and Drama Desk for Featured Actor in a Musical. He originated the role in Washington D.C. at The National Theatre and received a Helen Hayes nomination for his performance.
