(WASHINGTON)—The National Symphony Orchestra (NSO) announces its 2024–2025 Pops season with programming that continues to build on the Orchestra's legacy of innovation and efforts to reach beyond strictly classical music audiences. Steven Reineke leads the NSO in his 14th season as Principal Pops Conductor.

"I'm thrilled to perform with the NSO and a tremendous variety of artists this season," Principal Pops Conductor **Steven Reineke** said. "This season has so much to offer, from folk to Broadway to R&B and beyond. It's a joy to perform with the NSO, and I'm excited for audiences to experience this fun and innovative music as it comes to life on the Concert Hall stage."

FALL PROGRAMMING

- NSO Artistic Advisor Ben Folds presents three-time Grammy Award® winner and Matchbox
 Twenty frontman Rob Thomas in the DECLASSIFIED® series on September 6, 2024, joined by
 Grammy®-winning singer-songwriter Madison Cunningham and acclaimed acoustic fingerstyle
 guitarist Yasmin Williams.
- Lauded Broadway star (*The Lion King, Aida, The Color Purple*) and Grammy Award®—winning R&B artist **Heather Headley** will perform Broadway and R&B music with the NSO in a program led by Principal Pops Conductor Steven Reineke, **September 7, 2024.**
- Conductor Kellen Gray will lead **DC ORIGINALITY:** *Showcasing the Cultural Beat of Capital City*, celebrating the NSO's history of musical partnerships with the D.C. community. Curated by Kennedy Center Composer-in-Residence **Carlos Simon** and hosted by Emmy® and Golden Globe—

- nominated actor **Anthony Anderson**, the program will feature D.C. legends including **Ginuwine**, **Kenny Lattimore**, **The String Queens**, **D.C. Go-Go All Stars**, **Afro Blue**, **Imani-Grace Cooper**, **Christylez Bacon**, and more in tribute to the diverse musical heritage and unwavering spirit of Washington, D.C. on **September 10–11**, **2024**.
- Singer, songwriter, and actress **Sara Bareilles**, creator and star of Broadway's *Waitress* and hit songs such as, "Love Song" and "Brave," makes her return to the Kennedy Center, performing a career-spanning program on **September 24–25**, **2024**. This program will be recorded live for *NEXT at the Kennedy Center* on PBS.
- Grammy Award®—winning singer-songwriter **Aoife O'Donovan** shares the stage in a double bill of indie-folk Americana with acclaimed folk band **Bonny Light Horseman** on **October 22, 2024**.
- Indie icon and NSO Artistic Advisor **Ben Folds** will perform some of his classic songs and new music with the NSO at his first live solo recording since 2002 on **October 25–26, 2024.**
- The Voice of Whitney: A Symphonic Celebration is a multimedia tribute to the legendary artist, Whitney Houston, featuring never-before-seen footage of the artist in a unique audiovisual experience on November 8, 2024. The program will showcase hits from Houston's discography in new orchestral arrangements in collaboration with the Estate of Whitney Houston, Park Avenue Artists, and Primary Wave Music.

HOLIDAY PROGRAMMING

- Holiday programming kicks off with the beloved family film *Elf*[™] in Concert. John Debney's score will be performed live by the NSO, November 29–December 1, 2024.
- After selling out two shows at Carnegie Hall, Broadway star Jessica Vosk—who has played many
 roles including Elphaba in Wicked—joins the NSO and The Heritage Signature Chorale in A
 Holiday Pops! with Jessica Vosk, a holiday sing-along celebration held in the festively decorated
 Concert Hall, December 6–7, 2024.
- The multi-platinum Irish singing sensations **Celtic Woman** return to the Kennedy Center for the **White Christmas Symphony Tour**, a festive performance of Yuletide favorites, on **December 13–14, 2024**.

SPRING PROGRAMMING

- After two sold-out performances in the Concert Hall alongside Ben Rector last year, singer, songwriter, and multi-instrumentalist Cody Fry returns to the Kennedy Center with his signature fusion of pop and luminous orchestration in a program featuring indie band Sleeping at Last and pop-rock group LANY on February 11–12, 2025.
- The NSO brings another classic film to the stage, *Matilda* in Concert, with a live narration by acclaimed actor, producer, and director Danny DeVito, conducted by the film's composer, David Newman, on April 25–26, 2025.
- Composer Max Richter will partner with the American Contemporary Music Ensemble for a live performance of Richter's genre-defying solo albums, *The Blue Notebooks* and *In A Landscape*, on May 2, 2025. *Please note: the NSO does not perform on this program.*
- Hosted in Washington, D.C., WorldPride 2025 celebrates the 50th anniversary of Pride. As part of the celebration, the NSO will join John Bucchino and an array of special guests on May 21–22,
 2025 for the orchestral premiere of Bucchino's choral work, A Peacock Among Pigeons, based on the book by Tyler Curry and Clarione Gutierrez.

ABOUT STEVEN REINEKE

Steven Reineke is one of North America's leading conductors of popular music and is in his second decade as Music Director of The New York Pops at Carnegie Hall. Additionally, he is Principal Pops Conductor of the National Symphony Orchestra at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts and Principal Pops Conductor of the Houston and Toronto Symphony Orchestras.

Reineke is a frequent guest conductor and can be seen on the podium with the Chicago, Philadelphia, Dallas, San Francisco, and Detroit Symphony Orchestras.

On stage, Reineke creates and collaborates with a range of leading artists including Maxwell, Common, Kendrick Lamar, Nas, Ne-Yo, Barry Manilow, Cynthia Erivo, Sutton Foster, Ben Rector, Cody Fry, and Ben Folds, among others.

As the creator of hundreds orchestral arrangements, Reineke's work is performed worldwide and can be heard on numerous Cincinnati Pops Orchestra recordings. His wind ensemble compositions are published by the C.L. Barnhouse Company and are performed by concert bands perennially.
